Lehigh Valley Drug and Alcohol Intake Unit Annual Report (July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016)

The Lehigh Valley Drug and Alcohol Intake Unit moved the main office from 6 South Third St., Easton, Pa. to 100 North Third St., Suite 401, Easton, Pa. The Bethlehem office is located at 548 North New St., Bethlehem, Pa. 18018. The office at 44 East Broad St., Bethlehem, Pa, has closed and reopened at the New St. address. All offices are close to public transportation and parking is readily available.

The Lehigh Valley Drug and Alcohol Intake Unit is a Department of Health, Bureau of Drug and Alcohol, licensed assessment and referral site. The Northampton County, Easton and Bethlehem offices provide adult and adolescent assessments for county consumers. Funding is provided through contracts with Northampton County as well as the Department of Medical Assistance Behavioral Health Care Provider, Magellan Health Care. We also have private insurance agreements with the major insurance providers within Lehigh Valley allowing us to provide assessments to adults and adolescents with Behavioral Health coverage.

Throughout the 2015-2016 fiscal years, The Northampton County, Easton and Bethlehem Offices conducted 2574 assessments, 257 were adolescents and 2317 adults. There were 3788 assessments scheduled with 582 people that did not show up and 632 that cancelled. Alcohol and other Drug Treatment were recommended for 2509 individuals. This is an 8% increase in the number of assessments from last fiscal year. The number of adolescents assessments (257) increased slightly and the adult population increased over the last fiscal year.. The primary drug of choice was alcohol (45%), followed by Marijuana (32%) and Opioid (23%).

Intensive Case Management services are provided by the Lehigh Valley Drug and Alcohol Intake Unit through a contractual agreement with Magellan Behavioral Health. The Intensive Case Management Program has been terminated and replaced with the Certified Recovery Specialist Program. This program is located at 548 N. New St., Bethlehem, Pa.18018. The program is hands on in that there people in recovery supporting and assisting those in early recovery. The program is contracted with Northampton County Drug and Alcohol Services for citizens of Northampton County and a contract with Medical Assistance through Magellan Behavioral Health Care for Northampton and Lehigh Counties.

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Further initiatives in Northampton County include the collaboration with Northampton County office of Drug and Alcohol Programs in facilitating the Bethlehem Recovery Center, a drop in center for the recovery community. The program utilizes the Peer Recovery model in creating a community recovery atmosphere, providing mutual recovery support by experientially credentialed individuals. This facility is being highly utilized, hosting NA and AA meetings. There is also a young persons AA meeting that is well attended providing a much needed resource for the adolescent and young adult individuals. There is also a women's AA group that has been a welcome addition to the recovering community in Northampton County. Throughout this past fiscal year the Recovery Center has provided multiple services and events, including alcoholathons, karaoke nights, and various other sober activities. The Recovery Center has become known as a safe and sober place for individuals to receive support and resources on their road to recovery.

April of 2016, Northampton County has also utilized funding to open a drop in center in Easton, located at 117 North Third St., Easton, Pa. The program is called "Change on Third Street". The initiative is to provide services similar at the Bethlehem Recovery Center focusing on the needs of the recovering community in Easton and the surrounding areas.

The Easton and Bethlehem office has also collaborated with Northampton County in a Gambling initiative, evaluating individuals for gambling problems as well as providing information on gambling as well as treatment options. The Intake Unit provides SOGS (South Oaks Gambling Screen) the goal of these evaluations are to identify individuals that have a gambling addiction and refer them to appropriate treatment. Of the 544 SOGS provide this past fiscal year, 11% or 60 individuals were identified with gambling problem and referred for treatment.

The Lehigh Valley Drug and Alcohol Intake Unit, Northampton Counties' Office of Drug and Alcohol Abuse, is governed by Hortensius, LTD.
